

Syllable Blending with Full Visual (and Auditory) Cues - Offline Version

In this activity, the therapist guides the learner in blending two syllables into one word using visual and auditory cues.

Begin by showing the pictures of "snow" and "man." Say each word clearly, then write the word snow in blue under the snow picture, and man in red under the man picture.

Point to each word and picture as you say them slowly: "Snow... Man..." Then, show the picture of a snowman and write the word snowman underneath it, using two colors—snow in blue and man in red.

Point to each part while showing the corresponding pictures and say: "We added together snow and man to form a new word: snowman, which is made of two syllables—snow-man.

Exaggerate the blended word: "Snow...man... Snowman!" and have the learner repeat it.

Reinforce the blending by showing the tracing colored lines connecting the parts and pointing to each syllable as you say the full word again

You can repeat this activity with any of the other picture sets I have already prepared.

Simply follow the same steps for each word in the flashcards (provided in the PDF). These can be printed, laminated, and used with multiple clients or at home with your child.
